They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR. Each institution has its own policy for determining SRS eligibility and making offers. For example, you may also have to submit an EAS application institution-defined dates or attend a school in a particular region. SRS is not available for all courses. UNSW's New Academic Calendar from 2028

UNSW will move to a new academic calendar in 2028.

The new 'flex-semester' calendar is a semester structure for undergraduate students, centring on delivering the best learning experiences and outcomes for all our students throughout their lifelong education journey.

UNSW aims to introduce the new flex-semester calendar in 2028 which will replace the current 3+ calendar.

The new flex-semester calendar is structured around two 12-week teaching periods (semesters), each with a mid-semester break to support student wellbeing and learning. In addition, it includes two six-week summer and winter terms, providing opportunities for accelerated study, catch-up courses and opportunities for experiential learning. The transition to a flex-semester calendar aims to enhance the student learning experience, provide flexibility and choice, create more adaptable learning pathways, and strengthen UNSW's ability to meet industry and workforce needs. For those commencing students whose program will straddle both the current calendar and the new flex-semester calendar, the University will work to ensure minimal disruption to their studies. The University will support students to manage their study load and facilitate the completion of their degree program on time.

UNSW Change to the admission process for the Bachelor of Laws

UNSW is changing the admission process to the Bachelor of Laws. 2025 will be the last year we offer the Law Admission Test for entry into our Bachelor of Laws programs.

While the LAT will be offered in 2025, the following conditions now apply:

- Only students seeking entry in 2026 should sit the LAT in 2025
- If you sit the LAT in 2025, your results will no longer be valid for two years
- Year 11 students who sat the LAT in 2024, your results remain valid this year and can be used for entry in 2026
- The Law Admission Test (LAT) will not be included in the entry requirements for students seeking entry in 2027 and beyond The Law Admission Test will not be offered in 2026.

What is the UTS Early Entry program?

If you are a Year 12 student, the program allows you to apply for most UTS courses before your HSC/IB exams, using your Year 11 results. If your application is successful, you will receive a provisional offer. You will still need to complete your exams, as well as achieve a minimum ATAR depending on your course.

Who can apply for the UTS Early Entry program?

The UTS Early Entry program is open to high school students currently studying an Australian Year 12 qualification or International Baccalaureate (November exams only within the Oceania region). To be eligible, you must also be one of the following:

Australian citizen or permanent resident onshore international applicant.

What courses are included in the UTS Early Entry program?

You can apply for most UTS courses through the Early Entry program.

The courses not included are:

Bachelor of Accounting Co-operative Scholarship

Bachelor of Computing Science (IDeA)

Bachelor of Cybersecurity (IDeA)

Bachelor of Information Technology Co-operative Scholarship

Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Science (Exercise Therapy)

You can still apply for these courses through UAC and the **Schools Recommendation Scheme**.

How to apply for the UTS Early Entry program?

Applications are made through the **UTS Early Entry program application portal**.

You can choose up to three courses in your application, and only one offer will be made per application. UTS encourages you to put the course that you are most interested in as your first preference, as offers are made based on your highest eligible preference. At the start of your application, you will need to use a specific number and PIN. Your PIN is usually the first four digits of your date of birth. For example, if your date of birth is 03/10/2006, your PIN is 0310. The specific number you use will depend on whether you're a HSC, IB, or interstate student.

Credentials for UTS Early Entry applications

Use your NESA number (this is different to your school student number and your UAC number).

By providing your NESA number in your application, it allows UTS to access your Year 11 results automatically.

What ATAR is required for the UTS Early Entry program?

If you have received a provisional offer, you will need to complete your HSC/IB exams and achieve the following ATAR:

80 ATAR for law courses

75 ATAR for sport and exercise courses

70 ATAR for education courses

69 ATAR for all other courses.

UTS- Combine a paid cadetship with university study

If you are undertaking a paid cadetship, you can use the UTS Business School Cadetship Entry scheme to start studying at UTS. Find out what courses are available, whether you are eligible and how to apply.

What is the cadetship entry scheme?

The cadetship entry scheme is for Year 12 high school students who have secured at least a one-year paid cadetship. The cadetship provides cadets with paid employment while they undertake university studies, allowing you to combine the practical experience and professional development of employment with the academic challenge of a university degree.

What courses can I study through the cadetship entry scheme?

Who is eligible for the cadetship entry scheme?

To apply using the scheme, you need to show that you are involved in a cadetship and are eligible to matriculate. Involvement in a cadetship You can satisfy involvement in a cadetship by either:

currently undertaking a minimum one-year paid cadetship, or having received a cadetship official letter of offer for a minimum one-year paid cadetship and will start your employment in the year you are applying to UTS.

Eligibility to matriculate

To be eligible to matriculate at UTS, you must satisfy at least one of the following:

have attained a full NSW HSC or equivalent with an ATAR of 69 (excluding adjustment points), or

completion of a UTS Foundation Studies course, a recognised tertiary preparation course, associate diploma,

Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) diploma or advanced diploma, or

completion of one year full-time or equivalent of tertiary studies from a single course within the same institution, or be at least 20 years of age on 1 March for the year of intake (e.g. if you are applying to start your study at UTS in 2025, the date would be 1 March 2025).

How do I apply to UTS using the cadetship entry scheme?

To apply through the business cadetship scheme, you need to complete:

a Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) application. You must list one of the courses included in the scheme as your highest preference to be eligible. **cadetship entry scheme application form**.

The IDeA cadetship is designed for students who have recently completed high school.

However, applicants who have completed Year 12 within one year and have not started a university degree are also eligible to apply.

Successful applicants must demonstrate potential and motivation for the program. Applicants are chosen for interviews, and the final selection is based on the result of the interview and your ATAR.

UTS strongly encourages students to apply to all industry partners. To do so, you must submit an application form via UTS and lodge an application through UAC

Applying to UTS for Engineering or IT? Your Engineering and IT Questionnaire can strengthen your UAC application, even if your selection rank falls short by one to three points. Demonstrate your motivation and passion for these fields by submitting the questionnaire. Eligibility criteria

Your questionnaire will be considered for your UAC application if:

you are a current school leaver completing Year 12 (or equivalent)

you achieved a minimum selection rank of 75. This selection rank includes

your raw ATAR and adjustments

you've listed UTS Engineering or IT as your first preference in UAC.

Your questionnaire will not be considered if:

your preferred course has reached capacity

you are applying for the Bachelor of Information Technology Co-operative Scholarship

you are applying for the <u>Bachelor of Engineering Science/Bachelor of Laws</u> or the <u>Bachelor of Information</u> Technology/Bachelor of Laws.

How to submit your Engineering and IT Questionnaire through UAC download

Download the template, enter your personal details and UAC reference number, then answer the questionnaire. Make sure to keep within the word limits.

Step 2- Upload your responses

Head to UAC and attach your completed questionnaire responses as a PDF to your UAC application.

Double-check that all required information is filled out, including your name, date of birth, UAC reference number, and contact information.

Step 4 - Hit submit

Submit your application and breathe a sigh of relief! If you meet the eligibility requirements, you'll be considered for an offer in the UAC rounds.

How do I get an offer after submitting my portfolio?

The Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building will review all submitted portfolios.

If your portfolio is suitable and you meet the eligibility requirements, you'll receive an offer via UAC.

If you're unsuccessful, you'll still be considered for offers in later rounds (provided there are vacancies) based on any eligible academic study you have completed.

The Music and Sound Design Portfolio Scheme allows you to submit your work for up to five extra adjustments.

These adjustments will go towards your selection rank and improve your application to study at UTS.

The scheme is open from Thursday 14 November to Sunday 8 December 2024.

What is the Music and Sound Design Portfolio Scheme?

The scheme is offered for music and sound design courses to recognise your ability beyond what your ATAR allows. If you are worried you will not meet the minimum selection rank for your course, submitting your portfolio can add up to five adjustments to your selection rank.

Who is eligible?

To be considered for an offer from UTS, you must have applied through UAC and have put in a preference for at least one of the following UTS courses:

You must also meet the UTS matriculation standards – these are the minimum standards required for any UTS course.

a written submission of no more than 400 words explaining your interest in studying music and sound design at UTS and outlining your music and/or sound design interests and achievements. Include details of AMEB or other qualifications.

supporting audio-visual material including URL links to videoed performances, recorded composition, music production or sound design work (YouTube, Vimeo or SoundCloud recommended). A maximum of 3 items will be considered. For each item, include details of your role in their creation and details of collaborators or other sources of media submitted.

a 3-minute video recording of you talking to camera explaining the works in your portfolio and your role in their creation (YouTube or Vimeo recommended). You may highlight aspects of the work submitted that help identify this as your work and demonstrate your capacity for success at UTS.

a CV/resume. Once you are ready, submit your application below.

However, if you are feeling sad, down or anxious and these feelings have started to affect your everyday life, then it is important to find out what is going on and how you can manage it. Over 75% of mental health issues occur before the age of 25. It is never too early to start looking after your mental health and wellbeing so you can be the best version of yourself.

Things to consider before studying psychology

Psychology is a field where professionalism is of utmost importance. Psychologists need to participate in ethical conduct, which includes all forms of communication with clients. Skills that are essential in the practice of psychology include strong listening and communication skills, personal integrity, empathy and self-awareness.

During practice, a psychologist is expected to encounter clients who have a range of comorbidities and may require an interdisciplinary approach. This can mean liaising with a range of other health professionals. Psychologist Rebecca Ray also discusses how to treat clients with trauma without becoming traumatised yourself.

It can be challenging to stay composed in session with clients, and the practice of mindfulness can assist with this according to clinical psychologist Samantha Clarke. Another clinical psychologist Dr Tara Hickey has also incorporated
