Universities Admission Centre (UAC):

What is the ATAR?

The ATAR is a rank, not a mark.

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 0.00 and 99.95 that indicates a student's position relative to all the students in their age group (ie all 16 to 20 year olds in NSW). So, an ATAR of 80.00 means that you are 20 per cent from the top of your age group (not your Year 12 group). Universities use the ATAR to help them select students for their courses and admission to most tertiary courses is based on your selection rank (your ATAR + any applicable adjustments). Most universities also use other criteria when selecting students (eg a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test). https://www.uac.edu.au/future-applicants/atar?

SCHEMES

After you've applied for a course, consider also applying through UAC for a scholarship or access scheme:

Equity Scholarships assist disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education. They are awarded to students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those who receive Centrelink income support payments.

Educational Access Schemes help students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage gain admission to university.

Schools Recommendation Schemes are used by institutions to make early offers of undergraduate admission to Year 12 students using criteria other than, or in addition to, the ATAR. More information will be available on www.uac.edu.au

University Clinical Aptitude Test—(UCAT TEST):

The University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ) is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their medical, dental and clinical science degree programmes.

The test helps universities to select applicants with the most appropriate abilities and professional behaviours required for new doctors and dentists to be successful in their clinical careers. It is used in collaboration with other admissions processes such as interviews and academic qualifications. It is also an opportunity to stand out from other applicants and demonstrate aptitude for a demanding programme of study. The UCAT ANZ is a computer-based test delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout Australia and New Zealand. You must complete a two-step process using the Pearson VUE online registration system to register and then book a test.

Online Account Registration and booking a test: Opens 1 March and Closes 31 May, 2022. Testing begins 1 July, 2022 and last testing date will be 12 August, 2022. Results delivered to universities: Early September.

The test consists of five subtests: Verbal Reasoning, Decision Making, Quantitative Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning and Situational Judgment.
