Introduction:

UAC Applications Opening - Advice

Wednesday 1 April

Students will receive their UAC Pin and will be able to apply for undergraduate study as well as <u>Schools Recommendation Schemes</u>, <u>Educational Access Schemes</u> and <u>Equity Scholarships</u>. All semester 1, 2021 courses will be available from August. Early bird applications will close at midnight on **Wednesday 30 September** and offer rounds and other deadlines will remain the same as previous years.

Although not all courses for 2021 will be available, we encourage students to choose any 2021 course to complete their application and come back later to review and change their preferences as courses come available.

Schools Recommendation Schemes will close earlier this year. Mark midnight on **Sunday 20 September** in your diary as the new closing date for SRS.

All dates will be available on <u>UAC's website</u> from 1 April.

<u>UAC Advice - Check Your Course Start Date When Selecting Your Favourite Degrees</u>

When applying, you need to check the course start date before adding any courses to their preferences to avoid applying for a semester 2, 2020 course. If your preferred course isn't listed for first semester 2021, then UAC advise you to choose any course that starts in 2021 to complete your application. You can then come back later to review and change their preferences.

University Clinical Aptitude Test—(UCAT TEST):

<u>UCAT</u> is an admissions test required for entry into most medical, dental and some clinical sciences degree programs. Students interested in these courses need to check the <u>course description</u> to see if the course they're interested in requires them to sit UCAT. It will be held in various locations throughout Australia. UCAT ANZ testing takes place between 1 July and 31 July 2020. You must complete a two-step process using the Pearson VUE online registration system to register and then book a test.

Online Account Registration and booking a test: Opens 2 March, 2020 at 9am and Closes 11 May, 2020 at 5pm Testing begins 1 July, 2020 and last testing date will be 31 July, 2020. Results delivered to universities: Early September Late booking deadline: 18 May, 2020.

More information is found on the UCAT website: www.ucatofficial.com. UCAT is a 2 hour Computer based test. Students may choose where they want to sit their test at one of the Pearson VUE test centres located in Australia. And they may choose one of the dates offered throughout the month of July. The test consists of five subtests: Verbal Reasoning, Decision Making, Quantitative Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning and Situational Judgment. Adjustment factors are available to a range of eligible undergraduate students and are points that are added to your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or entry rank to give you an adjusted entry score. UC offers three types of adjustment factors: Subject adjustments, Educational Access Scheme (EAS) and University Priority Groups.

<u>The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS)</u> is available to current Year 12 students and provides an opportunity to secure an offer to a UC undergraduate course if recommended by their school.

<u>Portfolio entry</u> is offered by the Faculty of Arts and Design (FAD) for all applicants seeking entry to an undergraduate FAD course.

<u>Fast Forward</u> is an early offer scheme which allows currently enrolled Year 11 students from specified Australian schools and states to apply and receive conditional offers for admission to nominated UC courses.

<u>Special consideration</u> is available to all applicants to UC who have experienced circumstances that have impacted or disadvantaged their previous study who do not meet the criteria to receive bonus points

UTS Law First Year Peer Mentoring Program

Run in conjunction with the UTS Law Students' Society, this program is tailored to ease your transition into UTS Law. It provides a great medium for you to connect with your peers and senior law students, as well as an opportunity to develop your legal study skills. Each mentor group is led by senior year UTS Law students who volunteer their time to share their experiences and offer helpful advice to new students settling into the study of law. All mentors receive training provided by the Faculty of Law. Mentors work in pairs and run hour-long sessions over the first six weeks of each session.
