Discover a future of possibilities with MySydney which replaces the previous E12 scheme. MySydney offers every eligible student* starting in 2023, entry on a reduced ATAR, an \$8,500 per annum scholarship for the duration of their undergraduate degree and a range of additional support. No separate application is required. You do not need to apply for MySydney. UAC will automatically assess your eligibility based on the residential address you enter in your UAC undergraduate application. UNSW Girls In Engineering Club Registration Open for 2023

The Girls in Engineering Faculty of Engineering Admissions Scheme (GIE FEAS) Program is an alternate pathway program for high school girls in Year 11 and 12 who will be applying for an eligible engineering degree at UNSW Sydney and expecting an ATAR within the FEAS eligibility* range. The Law Admission Test (LAT) is required for all domestic applicants who wish to study an Undergraduate Law degree at UNSW, except for: • Indigenous students undertaking the Pre-Law Program at UNSW • students applying via UNSW Gateway • International Students (not eligible)

UNSW Gateway Admission Pathway

Offers released: An early entry pathway that acknowledges the ATAR is just one indicator of a student's capacity to succeed at university. Year 12 students apply through the new UNSW Gateway portal. Students identify two UNSW degrees they'd like to be considered for and upload a personal statement. Students' applications are considered on their personal statement and Year 11 results. They may also receive a phone call from an Ambassador following their submission. Successful applicants will receive an early offer or an early conditional offer and priority for UNSW Equity and Accommodation Scholarships. **Pathway Eligibility Criteria**:

Be an Australian resident. Complete an Australian Year 12 qualification in the year of application Attend a Gateway School and/or Live in a low socioeconomic area based on IRSAD and IEO indexes of SEIFA (Socio-economic Indexes for Areas)

Early Offers • A requirement of this offer is that students complete their HSC and receive an ATAR. • Very competitive. In Round 1 competitive students will receive an early offer and all other applicants will automatically be considered for an early conditional offer. • Early Offers in Round 1 only

Offers released: 1 September Firm offers: 15 December.

Early Conditional Offers • An offer is made with an adjusted ATAR requirement for a UNSW degree. If the student meets the adjusted ATAR stipulated within their conditional offer, they receive a firm offer to that degree.

Central Queensland University's (CQU) PRINCIPAL'S RECOMMENDATION SCHEME

CQU recognises that other factors and attributes, such as motivation, talent, and passion, have a key role to play as well as well as ATARS.

The Principal's Recommendation Scheme (PRS) provides an early entry pathway for Year 12 students to apply to an undergraduate CQU course based on the recommendation of their high school Principal rather than ATAR. Students can receive an offer within 48 hours of submitting their application - without waiting for their Year 12 results.

Open to all Year 12 students, the Scheme is designed to assist capable students to access entry to CQUniversity; it in no way provides relaxation of the quality and academic standards that students must meet to successfully complete their degree.

Applications for 2024 are opening soon and close on **1 December 2023**.

Co-Op Scholarship:

Co-Op Scholarships: WHAT IS A CO-OP SCHOLARSHIP?

Co-op Scholarships are offered by Macquarie University, UTS & UNSW. They are offered primarily in: Accounting, Actuarial, Business, Data Science & Decisions, Engineering, IT & Material Science. You can go to the university websites to see their range of courses. A Co-op scholar receives 12 months of Industry training throughout their degree. They are VERY desirable to employers upon graduation and are offered Graduate positions when they graduate. A co-op scholar will receive between \$15,000 - \$19,600 pa (tax-free) for the duration of their degree. It is yours to spend as you like. Students have a Professional Development Program, Leadership Training & Networking Mentoring opportunities as a Co-op scholar.Applications are done online

Universities look for students who:

- * show initiative & leadership,
- * make a significant contribution to school or community
- * can communicate well
- * enjoy working with other people,
- * want to be active within the university
- * have a real & genuine interest in the field they are applying to (you can choose up to 4),
- * are ambitious & keen to contribute,
- * care about what is happening in the community & world at large.

Your application must be well-written & within the given character limits (I will work with everyone who applies, to help you present your best possible application)

You then wait to see if you have been successful in gaining an interview All the best.

UTS: Bachelor of IT Co-op Scholarship:

Application will open in March and will close in September, 2023. Bachelor of Information Technology Co-operative Scholarship Program provides students with \$49,500 and two six-month full-time industry placements with sponsor organizations.

<u>UAC</u>

2024 UAC Admissions

Applications for the current Year 12 group will open on **5 April**. UAC will email all NSW and ACT students their UAC PIN on the same day. Applications for UAC's Access schemes will also open on **5 April**. UAC will also host another online **Year 12 Conference on 28 April @ 6pm**. Last year, 3,500 students and parents logged in to watch, making it the biggest UAC Digital event to date. Registrations will open very soon. An email with registration details will be sent in the coming few weeks. This year's UAC Guide is set to be delivered to schools early in Term 2 and will be handed in to students when received.

UAC's Access schemes

Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS)

There are no changes to the SRS process this year. However, the University of Sydney MySydney and UNSW Gateway schemes will not be part of SRS in 2023. You will receive information about these schemes very soon.

Educational Access Scheme (EAS)

There are several changes to EAS this year:

The six-month rule has been removed. Applications will be assessed for disadvantages that have occurred for any length of time up until 30 September of the year they complete Year 12.

Disadvantage codes F01K and F01S, which allowed students to claim financial disadvantage based on COVID-19 government payments, have been removed.

There is a new SEIFA disadvantage code, AG02, which works in the same way as AG01 but draws on the Australian Bureau of Statistics Index of Education and Occupation instead of the Index of Relative Socio-economic Advantage and Disadvantage. The day after they submit their application, students identified as meeting the criteria for either of these disadvantages will be notified that UAC has automatically created an EAS application for them.

The student's document cover sheet will include a checklist to help them understand what they need to provide. The Educational Impact Statement will require schools to answer fewer questions, making it a quicker and easier process for you.

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships are awarded to students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those who receive Centrelink income support payments such as ABSTUDY, Austudy, Youth Allowance, JobSeeker Payment, Disability Support Pension, Parenting Payment (Single) or the Carer Payment. Institution Equity Scholarships are funded by individual institutions and their value, eligibility criteria and duration differ between institutions. Most institutions also offer merit scholarships: apply directly to the institution for these.

<u>University Clinical Aptitude Test— (UCAT TEST):</u>

The University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ) is an admission test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their medical, dental and clinical science degree programmes. The test helps universities to select applicants with the most appropriate abilities and professional behaviours required for new doctors and dentists to be successful in their clinical careers. It is used in collaboration with other admissions processes such as interviews and academic qualifications. It is also an opportunity to stand out from other applicants and demonstrate aptitude for a demanding programme of study. The UCAT ANZ is a computer-based test delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout Australia and New Zealand. The test consists of five subtests: Verbal Reasoning, Decision Making, Quantitative Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning and Situational Judgment Students must complete a two-step process using the Pearson VUE online registration system to register and then book a test. Opens 1 March and Closes 17 May 2023.

Testing between 3 July 2023 and 11 August 2023. Results delivered to universities: Early September.

There are several different types of employment arrangements under Australia's workplace laws. One of the most common types that students work under is casual employment. Casual jobs are defined as jobs that usually:

- are short-term or temporary
- involve irregular hours
- aren't guaranteed to be ongoing
- provide extra hourly rate as they don't provide paid holiday leave or sick leave.

Casual employees are employed on an hourly, daily or weekly basis without any commitment – from the employee or the employer – that the job is permanent or guaranteed.
