Year 10 Work Experience Week:

Some of the most important decisions Year 10 students will make during their time at school are about what career directions and further study and training they will pursue when they finish their secondary education. One activity to support students with this planning is providing a curriculum-based workplace learning program. Workplace learning programs are learning activities in real workplaces that help young people to gain practical experience of work as well as learn industry and workplace skills as part of their studies. These programs are available in Year 10 and the Work Experience period is in Term 4- Week 8 from Monday 2 December until Friday 6 December 2024. Please make sure you allow me enough time prior to the closing date to fill in the school section, so you need to submit your application online by **Wednesday 15 May**, you will then be sent a letter that you will have to bring to me with the log in details for me to be able to fill in your school assessment and submit it before 22 May, 2024. To help you edit your application, finish your application during the April School Holidays and bring to me as soon as Term 2 starts to edit, advise on any changes and finalise before you submit online. Don't hesitate to come and see me for more clarification or if you have any questions.

UAC 2025 admissions

Applications for 2025 entry open on 3 April for domestic students. UAC will email UAC PINs to all NSW HSC and ACT BSSS students on 3 April. Students will need their NESA or BSSS student number and their UAC PIN to apply through UAC.

Access schemes

When applications for admission open, so will applications for the Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) and the Educational Access Scheme (EAS). This year there are a few changes.

SRS application changes

The SRS application is now part of the undergraduate application, like EAS. Once a student submits their undergraduate application, they can follow a link to SRS: there will no longer be a standalone application accessible from the UAC website. Students will be asked to confirm that their school's name is correct. If a student needs to upload their Year 11 results, they will be prompted to do so.

EAS process changes for schools

This year UAC will not accept emailed educational impact statements (EIS). However, if the school cannot give the EIS to the student to upload to their EAS application, the school will be able to upload it through the school Access portal (where the SRS ratings are completed).

In 2023, an increased number of applicants provided EIS from people not considered 'responsible persons' (eg parents, other relatives, gardeners, cleaners). This year UAC will add the definition of a responsible person to each document package.

EIS must be completed by the school's nominated person (Mrs. Saki). If this is not possible it must be completed by a responsible person, such as a doctor, lawyer, social worker, counsellor, or community or religious leader who has knowledge of the circumstances and the effect on the student's studies.

Finally, a reminder that EAS is only used for ATAR-based offers unless otherwise specified.

UAC publications:

UAC is no longer producing the UAC Guide. All information about the next admissions cycle will be updated on the UAC website from April. If students would like a printed information booklet, they can pick up a copy of *Steps to Uni for Year 11 and 12 Students* from one of the many expos UAC will be attending this year.

Steps to Uni for Year 11 and 12 Students will not be sent out to schools but it can be downloaded from the UAC website if needed.

Steps to Uni for Year 10 Students will still be printed and one copy for each Year 10 student will be sent to all NSW schools in early Term 2, as usual.

University of Sydney Key changes to entry requirements for 2025

Mathematics course prerequisites removed for many courses

The mathematics course prerequisite will be removed from several degrees, and we will be enhancing the university's targeted support to ensure commencing students are equipped with the knowledge base they need to successfully progress through their degrees. The mathematics prerequisite will still apply to courses in Advanced Computing, Pharmacy and Engineering (including streams and combined degrees). Students applying for courses that no longer have the mathematics prerequisite will now be eligible to receive an additional adjustment factor towards their selection rank through the <u>Academic Excellence Scheme</u> (AES).

Students can now stack adjustments from eligible entry schemes

Students will be able to combine their adjustment factors from two eligible entry schemes up to a maximum of 10 adjustment factors. Eligible entry schemes are the Educational Access Scheme, Academic Excellence Scheme, and Elite Athletes and Performers Scheme. All other schemes are excluded. Read about our entry schemes here.

Broadway Scheme renamed to Educational Access Scheme

The USYD Broadway Scheme has officially been renamed the Educational Access Scheme (EAS). The Broadway Scheme has always been the University of Sydney's Educational Access Scheme administered through UAC. This change means USYD is in line with UAC's naming convention and will reduce confusion regarding what the scheme offers. USYD also now recognises a broader range of assessed EAS outcomes. The University of Sydney- Future Leaders Scheme

School captains are no longer eligible for this scheme. This change has been made based on feedback from schools and because USYD found that most previous captain applicants already met course selection ranks with their ATAR or were being awarded equal or more adjustment factors through other schemes. It is used in collaboration with other admissions processes such as interviews and academic qualifications. It is also an opportunity to stand out from other applicants and demonstrate aptitude for a demanding programme of study. The UCAT ANZ is a computer-based test delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout Australia and New Zealand. The test consists of five subtests: Verbal Reasoning, Decision Making, Quantitative Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning and Situational Judgment Students must complete a two-step process using the Pearson VUE online registration system to register and then book a test.
