UAC

Apply for undergraduate study.

Applying is quick and easy. Look at the short video guides for Year 12 students. You can apply or log in between 7.30am and midnight (Sydney time) and UAC will automatically log you out if you are inactive for 30 minutes. There is a non-refundable processing charge of \$80.00 AUD. You can pay using Mastercard, Visa or PayPal. Your application is not complete until you have paid.

Do not submit more than one application in each admissions year. Duplicate applications will be cancelled. Log back into your application to update your contact details, qualifications, or course preferences. Offers are made on specific dates throughout the year. What is the ATAR?

The ATAR is a rank, not a mark. The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 0.00 and 99.95 that indicates a student's position relative to all the students in their age group. Universities use the ATAR to help them select students for their courses and admission to most tertiary courses is based on your selection rank (your ATAR + any applicable adjustments). Most universities also use other criteria when selecting students (eg a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test).

Pathways to your dream degree

Applying for university next year but worried that you won't meet the ATAR requirements for your dream degree? Most institutions offer pathway options for applicants who don't meet the standard entry criteria for their courses. Often, you will be able to find a different avenue into the course you

are aiming for. If you don't get an offer into your chosen degree because you haven't met the required lowest selection rank, you could start an alternative undergraduate course with a lower entry rank. Once you have successfully completed the first year of that degree, and have results that will improve your selection rank, you can then apply again for the degree you really want. ACU Early Entry Guarantee Applications Closing Soon

Closes 18 September Guarantee your place at ACU, even before your Year 12 exams. The ACU Guarantee program offers eligible Year 12 students a place at ACU based on Year 11 results. Offers may be made as early as July. While successful applicants must still complete their Year 12 exams, you can do so secure in the knowledge that your marks from Year 11 meet the entry requirements. You may also enhance your entry score by including a short personal statement that gives ACU an insight into your personal circumstances and motivation for university study.

The Australian Institute of Quantity Surveyors (AIQS) offers a scholarship program for Year 12 students who qualify for entry into a Construction Management course at an AIQS accredited university in Australia. The value of the scholarship is AU\$5,000 and includes:

- AU\$4,000 (\$1,000 upon enrolment, \$1,000 after completion of eight units, \$2,000 upon completion of degree). This is paid as cash into the student's bank account.
