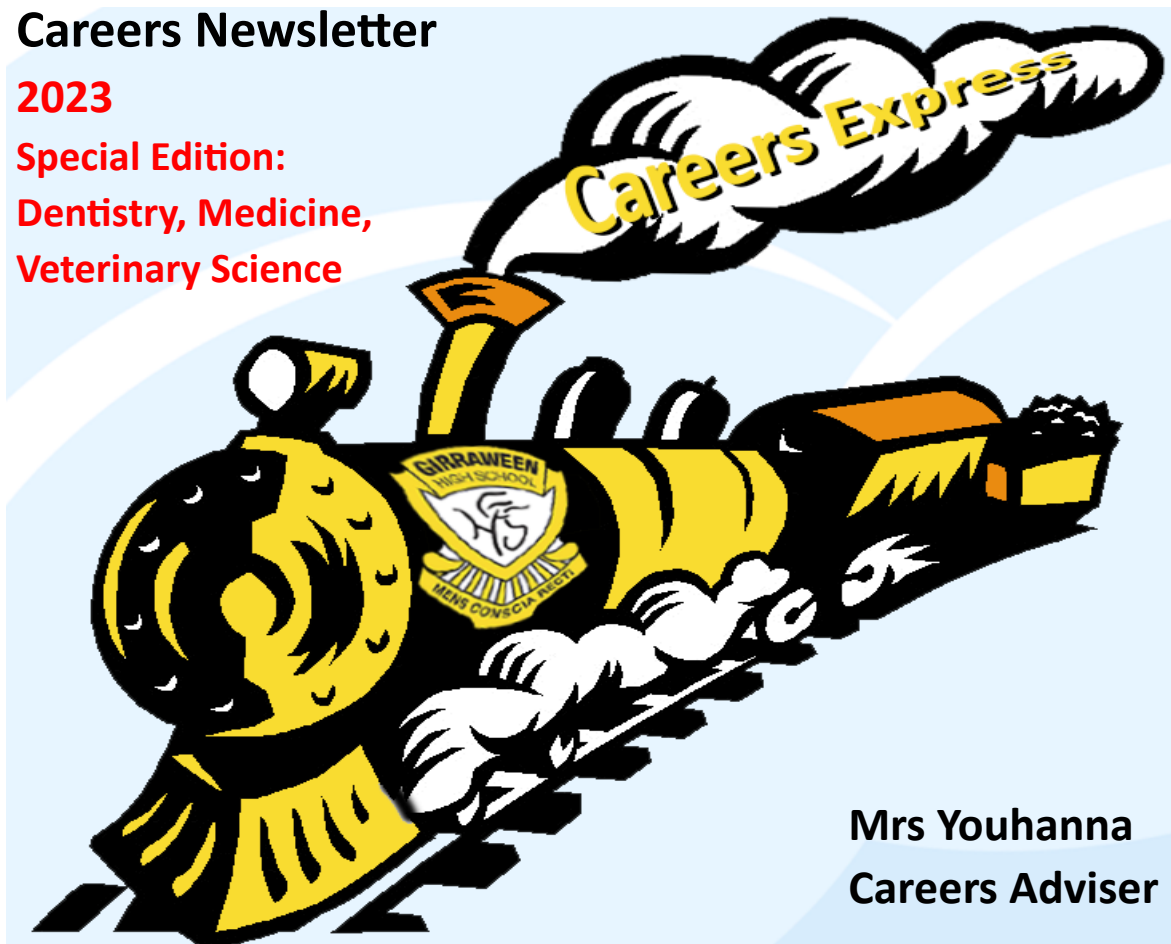

The Bachelor of Veterinary Biology / Bachelor of Veterinary Science double degree from Charles Sturt University will prepare you for a career as a registered veterinarian in Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Singapore, the United Kingdom and South Africa. This veterinary science degree was developed in close consultation with the veterinary industry to answer the needs of rural and regional communities for veterinarians who have the knowledge and skills to work with farm livestock and horses, companion animals and wildlife.

Applications for Session 1 2024 are now open and will close 31 August 2023

Admission to this course is based on the following criteria:

- A completed Higher School Certificate with a minimum ATAR of 90, inclusive of adjustment factors.
- A Supplementary Application Form. The Supplementary Application Form provides the opportunity to demonstrate your commitment to animals, livestock industries, veterinary science and rural / regional communities. To apply for this course, you will need to complete the following and upload it with your application: [Bachelor of Veterinary Biology / Bachelor of Veterinary Science Supplementary Application Form \(Domestic\).pdf picture_as_pdf](#)
- Apply to UAC and have this course as one of your preferences by **29 September 2023**, Early closing date applies.
- An interview with Charles Sturt University staff and representatives. The aim of the interview is to provide an opportunity for you to demonstrate your communication skills and further discuss your interest in and commitment to animal production and rural and regional veterinary practice. Initial interviews are held over four business days, in late November and early December. A further day of interviews may be offered in January.

Applicants deemed to be competitive, based on the application for admission and the supplementary form, will be invited to interview.

Offers:

Offers will be sent to successful interviewees following each UAC offer round in December and January.

Direct offers may be made from February.

Due to multiple offer rounds, interviewees may not receive notification of their outcome until all UAC and direct offers have been accepted in February/March.

Academic Requirements

Although there are no formal prerequisites for the Veterinary Science course at Charles Sturt, it is highly recommended that school leavers will have studied one or more science disciplines and high-level mathematics at Year 12 level. If you have not studied these subjects and are accepted to the course, it is strongly recommended you undertake a STUDY LINK subject before commencing the degree.

Application Process

The selection process for direct entry medicine at Clayton consists of three components; Year 12 (or equivalent) results, completion of the [UCAT ANZ](#) (University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand) and a Multiple Mini Interview (MMI). All three components are weighted equally.

Key Dates

September 2023 Apply through [VTAC](#) by the timely deadline: 5pm, **28 September 2023**

October 2023 **10 October 2023** - Applicants who have sat the UCAT in 2023 and have listed a VTAC preference for direct entry medicine at Monash will receive an email from the faculty providing them with additional information regarding the application process and instructions about how to apply for the Dean's Rural List (DRL). Applications for DRL will then close on **24 October 2023**. **Please note**, applicants will not receive any further correspondence regarding the outcome of their DRL application from the University but may receive a request to clarify any unclear submissions.

December 2023 **First round interviews Open to:** Victorian-based students; and any non-Victorian-based students who qualify for the Dean's Rural List (DRL). Selection for interview **based on UCAT ranking only**. Interviews to be held on Zoom on: **Tuesday 05 December 2023; Wednesday 06 December 2023; and Thursday 07 December 2023**. *Please note, interview dates are subject to change.*

January 2024 **Second round interviews** Open to: Victorian-based students; and any non-Victorian-based students who qualify for the Dean's Rural List (DRL). Selection for interview **based on an equally weighted combination of ATAR aggregate and UCAT**. Interviews to be held on Zoom on: **Wednesday 03 January 2024; and Thursday 04 January 2024**. *Please note, interview dates are subject to change.*

January 2024 **Third round interviews** Open to: All remaining students, including Year 12 completed interstate Selection for interview **based on an equally weighted combination of ATAR aggregate and UCAT**. Interviews to be held on Zoom on: **Wednesday 17 January 2024** *Please note, interview dates are subject to change.*

Important Note

Only applicants with at least one Medicine VTAC code on their preferences at the close of timely applications will be eligible for consideration. You cannot add a preference for Monash medicine after the close of timely applications. Similarly, applicants who remove Medicine from their preferences after the close of timely applications will not be able to add it back into their preferences and will not be eligible to be considered for the course.

Interviews

Monash uses a Multi Mini Interview (MMI) for the selection of students. The MMI consists of six sequential interview 'stations' focusing on an applicant's:

advocacy; collaboration; critical thinking; empathy; ethical reasoning; motivation; and resilience.

At each station, the applicant will have two minutes reading time with a scenario and will then be interviewed for eight minutes (i.e. ten minutes per station) with a 'circuit' taking 70-80 minutes to complete, factoring in time for pre-briefing and debriefing sessions. Applicants will be invited via email to participate in the MMI which will be conducted online via Zoom. Only a set number of applicants will be invited for an interview.

Selection for an interview in December is open to rural and Victorian students and will be based on the UCAT score alone. This is to ensure completion of the selection process within a tight time frame. ATAR (or equivalent) scores for these applicants will be included after the MMI.

Selection for an interview (MMI) in January is open to all remaining and interstate students, including Victorian students who may not have been interviewed in the December round, and will be based on a combination of an applicant's UCAT and ATAR (aggregate) scores.

The indicative UCAT ANZ score to be considered for interview is 3000. Please note, this indicative UCAT ANZ score would not apply to a Dean's Rural List applicant. The indicative UCAT ANZ score to be considered for interview for a Dean's Rural List applicant is 2700. These scores are indicative only and will change with each intake, depending on the distribution of scores and number of applicants applying to Monash each year.

Only those applicants who attend an interview will remain in the final ranked list to be considered for a place in the course.

Important Notes

All applicants applying for this course are only allowed to attend the MMI once. Those who are re-applying for this course and have previously attended the MMI for this course are not eligible to attend the MMI again.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend an interview via email and will be required to log in to an online system to self-allocate a time to attend. Once the system closes, changes will not be permitted and late requests cannot be accommodated.

Offers

Offers will only be issued through in the January and February VTAC rounds. No offers will be made in the December VTAC Round. For more information on VTAC offer dates, please visit the [VTAC website](#).

If you're in your final year of high school, you can apply for the Provisional Entry pathway. You must be completing Year 12 on your first attempt to be eligible.

The minimum entry requirements for this pathway are:

- Queensland Year 12 English or [equivalent](#)
- an adjusted ATAR 95.00 or equivalent
- a competitive [University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand \(UCAT ANZ\)](#) aggregate score from the year you apply.
- a [multiple mini-interview \(MMI\)](#).

The minimum required UCAT ANZ aggregate score depends on the performance of applicants and available places. For the 2022 intake, the lowest UCAT ANZ score for an invite to interview was as follows:

- Rural Access Scheme for Provisional Entry applicants was 2560.
- Provisional Entry applicants (not eligible for the Rural Access Scheme) was 3030.

This score varies each year and can't be determined in advance. If you're competitive for the next stage, you'll be invited to an MMI.

Meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission.

Progressing to the Doctor of Medicine

If you receive a Provisional Entry offer, you'll need to complete your first bachelor's degree at UQ before you start the MD program.

You have some flexibility to choose which program you'd like to study as your first degree, as long as:

- you meet the subject prerequisites for that program, and

What to expect at an MMI

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to participate in the MMI. MMIs are designed to assess your non-academic qualities and provide you with opportunities to demonstrate skills and qualities such as verbal communication, adaptability, and empathy.

The MMIs involve a circuit of interview stations. At each interview station, shortlisted applicants will respond to a scenario with a number of questions.

Applicants will move from one station to the next, with short breaks between each station. While there will be multiple applicants attending the MMIs, each applicant is interviewed on a one-on-one basis at each station.

The program provides a high standard of academic, clinical and professional medical training to equip graduates with the skills necessary to take up positions as hospital interns and thereby qualify for medical registration in Australia. Applicants must also complete the University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand (UCAT ANZ). Final ranking for a place is determined by combining scores from the applicant's Year 12 subject results that are used to calculate the ATAR (or equivalent) and their UCAT results.

Any student who gains entry into the BCSC will progress into Flinders University's Northern Territory-based Doctor of Medicine, as long as they pass all units and maintain a GPA of greater than 5 (credit). Enrolment will normally be full-time. The third year of the Bachelor of Clinical Sciences is the first year of Flinders University's MD taught in the Northern Territory.
