As a result, students who wish to apply for early entry into multiple intuitions will only have to complete one application. http://www.uac.edu.au/ srs/ SRS application opened on Wednesday 3 April, 2019 and close at midnight on Monday 30 September, 2019. In order to receive an offer through SRS you must have the course, for which you would like to be made an offer, as your first preference at midnight on Sunday 10 November, 2019. Most SRS offers will be made in November Round 1 on Thursday 14 November, 2019. If you are successful you will receive either an unconditional offer, which has no further requirements so simply accept it, or a conditional offer, which needs specific requirements such as; minimum ATAR.

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) - UAC:

Institutions acknowledge that difficult circumstances can prevent students from reaching their true academic potential, particularly if their educational performance has been affected by long-term disadvantage beyond their control and choosing. Educational Access Schemes (EAS) can help you gain access to tertiary study if your ATAR is below the course cut-off.

You must submit your UAC application before your EAS application. Read carefully the instructions for completing the form, the descriptions of the reasons and their codes. Work out which disadvantages apply to you (you may be eligible for more than 1). Any statement made by you, your doctor, the School Counsellor, the Head of Wellbeing, the Deputy Principal or the Year Adviser must state what the problem is and how it affected your studies

(FEAS) is a possible alternative admission pathway for the admission of undergraduate students to UNSW Faculty of Engineering degree programs (including the BSc Computer Science and the BSc Food Science (Hons) who do not meet the published Guaranteed Entry selection rank* requirement of 92.00.

Selection rank* 92.00+ Admission on basis of selection rank or equivalent

Selection rank* 82.00-91.95 Admission on basis of FEAS

Entry selection rank figures given includes ATAR + adjustment factors. These include points for UNSW Access Scheme, Year 12 Subject Adjustment factors (HSC Plus), and Elite Athlete and Performers.

Students who achieve a selection rank (ATAR or equivalent + adjustment factors) between 82.00 and 91.95 and have submitted an application will be considered for admission under the Faculty of Engineering Admission Scheme (FEAS).

Step 3 ~ FEAS Application ~ Video. Submissions

The <u>Guaranteed Entry</u> selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) for admission to most UNSW Engineering programs in 2018 is 92.00.

For those with a selection rank below 92.00, the Faculty recognises that there are a number of factors which signal the potential of these students to succeed in engineering programs. These factors include the ATAR (or equivalent), ability in mathematics and knowledge of physical science, design and problem solving, and attitude and motivation toward engineering studies.

If you anticipate achieving a selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) between 82.00 and 91.95, then to ensure you have an opportunity for admission you will need to submit an application under the Faculty of Engineering Admission Scheme (FEAS). As part of this process you will answer some short written questions and upload a short wideo to demonstrate how you are suited to engineering studies. Note that previously, the FEAS application (Step 3) included an interview and was optional, but recommended. For the 2018 intake, the FEAS application is required. There are no interviews.
